Deputy Director of National Intelligence for Collection

In May 2005, Mary Margaret Graham was appointed as Deputy Director of National Intelligence for Collection. In this role, Ms. Graham works on behalf of the Director of National Intelligence to coordinate and integrate the collection efforts of the 15 intelligence agencies and ensures that the DNI priorities are appropriately reflected in future planning and systems acquisition decisions.

Mary Margaret Graham recently served as the Associate Deputy Director for Operations for Counterintelligence at the Central Intelligence Agency. In her 27 years with the CIA, she has had numerous field and headquarters assignments. From 1999 to 2001, Ms. Graham served as Chief of the Directorate of Operations' National Resources Division. She also served as the Executive Assistant to the Deputy Director of the National Security Agency.

Ms. Graham has earned two prestigious medals for her service: the National Intelligence Medal of Achievement in 1996 and the Donovan Award in 2001.

Ms. Graham is a graduate of Marywood College in Scranton, Pennsylvania and obtained a Masters degree in Russian Studies at The Maxwell School of Syracuse University.
